This report outlines community consultation that was undertaken pre-pilot and in-market. Further consultation took place in March 2021 and feedback was taken to the March Council Meeting. In this round of consultation, 195 submissions were received which highlighted:

- 62% of respondents were in support of the vision presented for Formosa Street
- 72% of respondents were in support of the vision presented for Church Street

# **Drummoyne Shared Spaces Pilot – Community Feedback Summary**

Pre-pilot and in-market consultation was undertaken to assess the community's response to the trial. A summary of consultation methods can be found in appendix 6: Consultation Actions Summary.

The following report summarises feedback provided to Council via the Collaborate Canada Bay community engagement website, direct emails, phone calls, and at events held in the spaces during the pilot period.

Business feedback is anecdotal only and based on conversations with the newly re-established Drummoyne Chamber of Commerce.

## Pre-pilot consultation - 28 September - 28 October 2020

36 submissions were received during the pre-pilot consultation period.

55% of participants supported the proposed closure of Formosa Street, while 50% supported the proposed reduction to one-way traffic on Church Street. 20% of participants hadn't made their mind up about Church Street at the time of this consultation.

Overall, perceived concerns centred on traffic, congestion and parking in the vicinity. Participants who supported the proposed pilot believed the project to be a step in the right direction in creating a community friendly space. Several participants stated they would never support the closure of Formosa Street at Lyons Road due to the access it allows to businesses and, in particular, medical services.

#### Business feedback

20% (7) of participants were local businesses, with most providing feedback on the Formosa Street closure. Two medical providers shared their concerns about access to parking for their patients. One business owner showed support for the concept pending the running of the pilot, while three business owners cited access concerns from Marlborough Street and East Drummoyne.

Council officers also door-knocked the shopping precinct to alert businesses to the pilot in September 2020. Most businesses were in support of Council actions to improve foot traffic and promotion of the area, while some were concerned about parking and convenient access to their businesses.

## In-market consultation - 28 October - 31 December 2020

153 submissions were received during the in-market pilot period.

Just over half of participants support the pilot spaces – 54% for Church Street and 52% for Formosa Street. When removing market event feedback (which showed generic support for the market concept), Formosa Street support is 45% support to 41% against.

Support for the pilot included:

- Community outcomes (45 submissions)
- Local business outcomes (17)
- Support for markets and other events (21)
- Ideas for improvements (19)

Issues arising from the consultation included:

- Location (27 submissions)
- Traffic and congestion (41)
- Parking (27)
- Noise and safety concerns (24)

## Business feedback

5% (8) of participants were local businesses. The feedback was mostly against the pilot, with access and parking issues for some businesses remaining at top of mind. However, during activation periods, Council observed Church Street businesses enjoying consistently good trade, with one café adding a dinner service to capitalise on the pilot. Likewise, the strata management company for the apartments on Church Street also put on evening music activations to bring the space to life for its patrons.

## Church Street feedback

54% of respondents support and 33% do not support the reduction to one-way traffic on Church Street, while 7% stated they didn't have an opinion and 5% remain undecided.

Residents appear to support the concept and execution of this shared space more than Formosa Street due to its proximity to dining businesses and natural shade. Despite this, the issue of noise and safety from busy Victoria Road is a key concern, as is noise abatement measures for the closest residents who live directly above the shared space.

"I love the idea of creating community spaces in Drummoyne. I suggest closing Church Street completely and making it a pedestrian precinct. That way attractive barriers can be put up to block the eye sore and noise of traffic on Victoria Rd. It will also feel safer for parents with kids. It's a great area for the venues already there to spill out." — Drummoyne resident

#### Formosa Street feedback

52% of respondents support and 35% do not support the closure of Formosa Street, while 7% stated they didn't have an opinion and 6% remain undecided at the end of the pilot period.

While a majority of participants support the pilot, local residents were very vocal about the issues surrounding the use of Formosa Street as a shared space. Council officers received 8 phone calls and 14 emails regarding these concerns which focused on the issues of access to the shopping precinct by car, antisocial behaviour in the space on weekends, and a lack of usage of the space when not being activated by Council.

It should be noted that 24% (36) of supportive responses came from feedback submitted during the Formosa Street markets. This feedback could be interpreted as supportive of markets in general as opposed to location of the markets in the space itself. Similarly, 6.5% (10) opposing responses were submitted during the Formosa Street markets.

When removing these submissions, overall support for the Formosa Street shared space is 45%, while opposition is 41%, no opinion is 6.5% and uncertain 8%.

"I think the space is going to be fabulous and already notice people using it during the day ranging from singles eating lunch, people taking a break, people sitting and waiting for friends etc. Better seating, more shade and a bit of greenery will encourage more people to gather including the young mum's out for a stroll, the older people taking a break from their walk or shopping and the young simply sitting and checking their phone while they wait for their friends. A friend and I went up the other day with her toddler so he could learn to ride his trike in a safe environment. A place of many possibilities and, having a clean public toilet nearby is a big plus. A coffee cart would probably be a winner as well." - Drummoyne Resident
