











# Companion Animals Act 1998 responsible dog owner requirements:

When using Council's off-leash dog parks, owners are liable under legislation if their dog attacks a person or animal. Please ensure your dog:

- Is under the effective control of a competent person
- Will return to you when called
- Is not a nuisance to other dogs and their owners
- Is on a lead when outside of the off-leash parks
- Is not a dog that has been declared menacing, dangerous or a restricted breed that is prohibited in off-leash areas.

Note: on the spot fines for breaches of these requirements may be issued by Council officers.

## Pet registration:

It is a mandatory requirement to register pets with your local Council. It is an offence under the Companion Animals Act 1998 to not microchip and register your dog.

Registering your pet and keeping your records updated assists in the return of your pet if it is ever lost. Visit <a href="bit.ly/petregistration">bit.ly/petregistration</a> to learn more.

Keep your dog on a lead whenever in public. Take your dog out for regular exercise and undertake vet health checks to ensure it remains fit and healthy.

## **Protecting our Godwits:**

The City of Canada Bay is one of the few areas in Sydney where critically endangered Bar-tailed Godwits still survive. They are sensitive to disturbance and fearful of dogs. If you own a dog, you can help protect these birds from extinction.

#### "My dog is playful and will not harm the birds!"

The problem is not dogs killing birds, it is dogs chasing or disturbing birds when they need to forage. Migratory shorebirds need to feed sufficiently to rebuild their strength for the 11,000km flight back to the Arctic summer. If they don't get enough food or rest, they are unlikely to survive their journey.

### How can dog owners help protect the Godwits?

Obey leash laws – keep your dogs on a leash, especially along the foreshore, and never allow them to chase birds. Go around large flocks of birds – whether they are feeding or resting, these birds need plenty of space. If birds run or fly away, you are too close. Clean up after your dog – picking up your dog's poo reduces the chance of harmful bacteria impacting other dogs, wildlife and the water quality of Parramatta River.


